Speaker 1 01:05 Heather. Hello, Heather. Hi, you have without a doubt a very large number of talents. I do. Thank you. You're welcome.

Speaker 0 01:16 Can you start by telling us a little bit about what you've done in your life thus far?

Speaker 1 01:20 Yeah, so for the past few years I have been working in the sex industry. Um, I've done every single job known in the sex industry besides porn. So I have been a stripper and exotic dancer. I've been a webcam model. So webcamming entails having a live show where users can watch you, do whatever you want, it's usually of sexual nature and they can tip you and they can also purchase like private shows via this like live webcam show. And then I've also done full service sex work.

Speaker 0 01:56 When you were growing up and you lost your virginity for the first time, you were just getting started, you were dating. At what point did things make this switch from say normal girl reality to this?

Speaker 1 02:08 Yeah, so that's a really great question. I lost my virginity. I would say later. I think that most, I dunno, I was almost 19 and I grew up in a very, I would say, structured household. We went to church every Sunday and w w we were always involved in the church. I always identified with being a Christian until I was like out of high school. And then I had just several serious monogamous relationships up until I danced up until I became a stripper. And so that was kind of the, my first introduction into sex work was becoming a dancer. I guess I never knew a lot about stripping, so I never really thought that I would be a dancer until I had a friend who was a dancer and I kind of go, I went and watched her perform and she was like, you should do this.

Speaker 1 02:57 Like it, you ma, you'd make great money, you're a good, you're pretty like, you can make a killing doing this, try it. And I had it like kind of a support system with me. Yeah, so growing up, um, I went to a performing arts school where I sang and danced and did theater. I remember doing shows with different members of my family singing, playing.

04:27 You knew how to dance, but did you know how to dance and twerk and grind now I didn't even know how to shake my ass and she, we went, we actually went to a pole studio and she showed me like some poll moves and I always thought pole dancing was so beautiful and it was like so awesome and acrobatic and didn't have to be sexual but could definitely be sexy and like tantalizing and all that fun stuff. So she showed me some moves and I sucked at it at first. Then she showed me how to twerk and like my body type I have, I have a big ass. And she showed me and I took to it really quickly and it kinda gave me an empowerment of like something that I'd never been able to do and now I like, I look good doing this, you know? 05:15 And then you get the satisfaction of people paying you for doing that. What were your first few nights and attempts like were you nervous, were you excited? I was absolutely excited. I had zero expectations because I didn't know what to expect. I remember my audition, I made \$40 and I was like, Oh my God, I just made \$40 in five minutes. This is amazing. You know? And I am the type of person that likes to see like where things can go and like what can I build from this? And I was just thinking of dollar signs. I could make so much money and I was having so much fun and I was really, really excited and like super all in when I started. Who are you living with at the time? I was living with some roommates up in Vancouver. Did your parents know or did you told my mom.

Speaker 1 06:10 My mom was more open minded. My dad is a great man but he is very closed minded to those types of things and he still goes to church and he has some certain views on, you know, what, what his daughter should be doing. So I didn't tell him and I also told every single person in my family what I was doing except him so that they wouldn't find out and run to him. And what were you raised religiously? Christian. Christian. Okay. Yeah. You have in my estimation, a very strong self image, self esteem, very confident. Would you agree with all that? Yes. I think you like yourself very much. You love yourself. Yes. You don't do drugs correct. You don't drink. Right. And I think most people have an image in their mind of what a stripper or dancer or sex worker would be. Yes, absolutely.

So a lot of times you're focused on that, but sometimes you're just not feeling it and you can feel that men are energetically taking from you in the club. There could be customers that are completely platonic and just want to care for you and pay you to support you. And there are some that want to try to get away with a, B, C, D and E and not even pay you a dollar. But I didn't use discernment in the way that, how am I going to say this? I didn't have an eye for who was going to give it back to me. I just, I just tried to connect with everybody. I couldn't discern between who was going to bite and who was just there to sip on that beer for three hours, but I learned that I learned that guickly after getting rejected and noting in my head, okay, this guy was like this, this guy did this, and he really did treat it as a business because I was there for five hours and wanted to make as much money as possible in those five hours

Speaker 0 14:54 in the podcast to talk a lot about rejection and how women very often can't stand facing in or dealing with it. Not even for a moment, but here you have to face it head on all the time and constantly, and I can only imagine there has to have been a period where it just sucked for you or did you have a different kind of experience?

Speaker 1 15:11 I was really fortunate in the fact that I didn't really get rejected too much of course, because I just like at the beginning I guess I just, I tried things and they worked and then I would tell others, Hey, this worked for me. There was this big stage that had two poles on it, so you could go on stage with a friend, um, or you could even go on the same pole like with, with a friend. A lot of times guys, if they like you, then you can kind of bring your friend. And like for me, I had a friend that was having a little bit of trouble making money and I knew that I could convince the guy to take us both upstairs because he wanted to spend time with me. So he was still willing to just pay an extra fee for her and she would get paid. And that's kind of all it was about. And then I would have her back and she would have my back. And so it opens the opportunities for making more money when maybe you're just not, it's just not your night. All the guys like this and this girl was blonde hair, blue eyes and I'm dark hair, green eyes. So there was guys that would particularly like her, they wouldn't really like me. They like blonde girls. They would pay for me to come up just because they liked her and then vice versa. So it helped with making money on those nights. That may not have been your night.

Speaker 0 17:30 Portland. As I understand it, the rules are a lot more laid back. You can dance fully nude people can be more hands on and physical. Yes. And that's very different than where we are here in San Diego. So what were your boundaries or limits? How did you establish that? Did it just cost more to do more and is that what led into

--:51 some sex work? Yeah, absolutely. So in Portland it's a fully nude club. All clubs are fully nude and they also have alcohol served, which is different from here in California, different. I've danced in Reno, in Nevada, it's different there. And also they promote it's full contact. So that just tells you that you can touch, this is where boundaries really come in handy. What is full contact mean exactly? Like they can touch you anywhere. No, no. But do they give people the impression that that's it's now they don't like marketed on their flyers or whatever, but girls will be like, yeah, this club is fully nude, full contact. Like that's a thing. Wow. So there's girls that'll let the guys be handsy and there's, there's, there's cameras, but there are the girls that are a little more in with management that management allows the high paying customers to come in, get a champagne room, pay the \$400 fee to the club and let these things happen in the champagne room because they know that they're going to get \$400 every single time that this particular customer comes in.

Speaker 1 19:00 So there are those girls that will do more in the club. I was never somebody that did that in the club just for sanitary reasons. And also I wanted to get to know the customer more and it just wasn't comfortable for me. But I imagine you might've been witness to some events. Yes. Oh, was I? I had several interesting, shocking, caught me off guard experiences. I was in the, it was just behind a curtain, a little section behind a curtain where you do the 20 and \$40 dances and you can charge whatever you want in those because the club doesn't keep track. But I was getting undressed and like dancing and I sat down on his lap and it was wet. Oh boy. So he had came in his pants before I'd even like sat down on his lap and I just immediately grabbed my stuff, looked at him and I was like, seriously?

And he was like, I don't know. You're too hot. And I'm just like, Oh Lord, 20:01 boy. Goodness. So I just left and it really grossed me out and I like had to clean myself up even though I don't think anything got on me still. It's disgusting. You're a very clean person. Yeah. Yeah. And that's why I didn't like, I never allowed, like, you know, guys would be like, can I finger you now? There was a time where I was hustling these guys and I could, I would tell them they could do anything they wanted and then when we got in the dance, either I realize one, they weren't even trying, they didn't even try. They just wanted to hear it. And two, I just didn't let him and I was like I'd ever said he could do that. So you found a way around it? Yeah, safely. Speaker 1 20:47 Yeah. So we had this beautiful place, you know, floor to ceiling. Windows opened up to the view of the city, the whole skyline. 24:42 The river is right there. And so we put up a pole because we wanted to practice. He found that place for you? We found it. You guys found it? He took care of it. Yeah. And then you both were living together? Yeah. Where on average would it stop in terms of the contact that they can have with you? How far could they go? Could they touch your breasts, caress you, dance with you? Anything sexual? It would be about the same. That would be at the club. So I mean, yeah, they could touch our boobs, our ass and we were dancing on them naked and then say I felt comfortable with a guy that I knew was well off. I would maybe offer them to stay and have full service sex work go down. And that happened a couple of times and it was fine and I felt safe having them in my home and being in a vulnerable position with them because not everyone is an asshole.

Speaker 1 33:35 There were less assholes than not. Did you say you felt safe to offer or they would ask? A lot of times they would ask and sometimes I offered if I felt comfortable. Sometimes there are too. I'm nervous to ask, even though they do want it a lot. Sometimes they're just too nervous to ask. Was it in these specific moments in this special pen house that you had where the sex work began or is there another story where you had your first sexual experience that was paid for? Yes. So I was dancing, um, and this guy saw me on a different stage. He was sitting at one stage and I was dancing on the other, this is what he told me. And uh, when I got off stage, he came right up to me and was like, I want to spend time with you, you know?

Speaker 1 34:26 And I was like, okay, how much time do you want to spend? He said, whatever you want. I said, all right, let's go straight to the champagne room. So we went to the champagne room and spent an hour together and we were having a good time and he seemed like trustworthy and he wasn't like super handsy and wasn't trying to get more than he paid for. He just really was like in awe of me telling me how beautiful I was and that I caught his attention from across the club and that he couldn't take his eyes off me and he just like truly wanted to spend time with me. And then I met this guy from Miami who was doing business in Portland and he would come to the club all the time and he would spend lots of money on me and it was super hot and a very, very, very good manipulator. And I brought her to my house and we didn't have sex like right off the bat. And he just kept coming back to see me at the club and it's like, it felt like he just wanted to like support me and he kinda played me at my own game, but I did date him. I actually moved to Florida for him and he was supporting me. I went there like not, I didn't like pack up and leave. I just kinda like went there and never came back. So I went to visit him.

Usually the performers in front of a webcam or on their laptop and they can do it from the privacy of their own home while everyone else can watch. And often, unless the performer wants to limit it, there's no limit to the number of people who can watch sign in tip and play.

I took it a step further, so I ended up being really successful really fast on this camping site because I was very personal with clients and I had a really no reservations. One thing that I liked about the camming website was I could block certain States so I could block anyone from like say a state that I had a family member living in. I've walked that state. Oh wow. I'm like, what if they log on and I'm a top one of the top earners there. I'm going to be on a featured page. So I'm, I was thinking these things through like what if I'm on the front page and they click on me and it's their niece. Like you. I just didn't want that to happen. Speaker 0 48:20 We tal --

-- ked earlier about you telling your family, everyone except your dad that you stripped, where they also privy to any other, the other sex work or camming.

Speaker 1 48:31 I would say my family to my knowledge was pretty inexperienced with sex work. Like there was no talk of like the guys go into strip clubs when I was younger, like I didn't hear about my family members like going to strip clubs or, I mean I'm sure they watched porn but no one ever talked about it. So they were privy district clubs. I knew that, you know obviously like the younger members of my family, like my cousins and stuff like they knew, but I told them like, Hey, I'm dancing. Like don't tell my dad. And if he finds out like if he asks you say no just in case they find out too. And my dad finds out, they're like, Oh my God, they're freaking out together or whatever might happen just to kind of like save my ass because I just, it wasn't worth, he would never understand it from my perspective. I am this full package experience and you're not going to be disappointed. I have an I do receive back that same energy. Okay, so the next thing then you're very sensual person. You're very in touch with yourself. You know yourself, you have spiritual practice, you know a lot about the ways of the world. Is sex and intimacy transactional for you? Yes and no. While I was a very active full service sex worker, when I was doing a lot of full service sex work, I became a little detached from like sensuality and intimacy because if I give them all this intimacy they're taking from me, I never really received it back. I was doing it all and because I was super, but you have to be super invested in it. And I, I got burnt out on doing that. So I definitely won't cam again. But it's not bad. Kimmy is not bad as far as like sugaring goes. That's something that I --

-- 'm open to, but I'm much more selective now.
